
What Happening

We are seeing an increase in Trailer Park brakes NOT being applied at sites. Luckily! there have been no injuries, SO FAR!

Findings:

• Drivers are <u>not</u> checking the trailer park brake had been applied as part of their precoupling/ uncoupling checks. When collecting and dropping trailers.

• Drivers are <u>forgetting</u> to apply the truck handbrake increasing the risk of Truck and Trailer Rollways.



Recommendations:

- ✓ Before exiting the tractor unit, the driver must always apply the tractor unit park brake switch of the engine and remove the ignition keys.
- Tractor units should be fitted with audible alarms to warn the driver that the tractor unit park brake has not been applied when exiting the cab. The alarm must operate regardless of ignition key state
- Trailer park brakes must be applied on all uncoupled trailers. <u>Disconnecting the red air</u> <u>line does not</u> automatically engage the trailer park brake! The trailer park brake must be activated separately by pulling it on!
